9 Paris Fire of 1916, which occurred when she was 11 years old; and

15 returning to Paris in 1945, where they owned and operated Williams'
16 Sporting Goods; and

17 WHEREAS, The matriarch of a cherished family that has grown
18 to encompass four generations, Mrs. Williams takes great pride in
19 her daughter and son-in-law, Patsy and Norman Davis; her four
20 grandchildren and their spouses, John and Connie Davis, Susan and
21 Steve Bellene, Jim and Susan Davis, and Sally Cosgrove and her
22 husband, the Reverend Mike Cosgrove; and her great-grandchildren,
23 Jeff, Sara, Laura, and Bryan Davis, Alisha and Tommy Huff, Patrick
24 and Alison Bellene, and Madeline, Samuel, CarolAnne, and Hannah

1 Cosgrove; and

2 WHEREAS, This lovely lady is a loyal congregant of the First
3 Baptist Church, where she has taught Sunday school and participated
4 in the Women's Missionary Society, while her further civic
5 involvement has included study and garden clubs as well as various
