RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The cultural, historical, and economic 2 contributions of Orange County are of singular importance to Texas, 3 and on January 31, 2005, a delegation of proud citizens from this 4 vital region are visiting the State Capitol to celebrate their 5 county's rich legacy; and

6 WHEREAS, Named for an orange grove found flourishing on the 7 banks of the Sabine River by French and Spanish explorers, Orange 8 County was created in 1852 from the East Texas county of Jefferson 9 and is bordered on the east by the Sabine River and on the south and 10 west by the Neches River; and

WHEREAS, With its temperate climate and long growing season, 11 12 this East Texas gem is a significant producer of nursery plants, forestry products, citrus fruits, dairy products, crawfish, and 13 14 cattle; industrial development also has brought prosperity to area 15 residents, many of whom work in shipping, shipbuilding, manufacturing, and petrochemical processing; and 16

WHEREAS, Blessed with heavily wooded acreage, marshes, grasslands, and an abundance of water, Orange County is an ideal location for such activities as freshwater and saltwater fishing, hunting, and bird-watching; and
