1           WHEREAS, The Texas Historical Commission fosters a deeper

3 local economies through its Texas Heritage Trails Program; and

5 preservation community and the tourism industry, the Texas Heritage  
6 Trails Program aids in preserving, protecting, and promoting  
7 historic and cultural resources, while providing visitors the  
8 opportunity to learn about local customs and traditions; and

9           WHEREAS, This outstanding initiative provides technical,  
10 educational, and financial assistance to regions throughout the  
11 state in an effort to help community leaders promote and enhance  
12 heritage tourism attractions; since its inception, 10 disparate  
13 geographic territories in Texas have been identified, each

15 include the Texas Forts, Independence, Forest, Lakes, Brazos,
