WHEREAS, A vital member of the *Express-News* team, Mr. Huerta oversaw the allocation of editorial and advertising space and amicably resolved the inevitable conflicts that arose between the two departments; he is credited with moving production into the digital age, and, thanks in part to his contributions, the paper now boasts one of the most technologically advanced layout systems of any newspaper in the country; and

WHEREAS, This notable Texan was active in a number of occupational and community organizations, serving as president of the American Newspaper Layout Managers Association, as an officer on the Deco District board, and as a member of the Jefferson Neighborhood Association and the Jefferson/Woodlawn Lake CDC Board; and
