WHEREAS, Born in New York City on April 24, 1919, Bob Ross relocated to San Antonio in 1941 and enjoyed a successful career as a builder of homes and apartments; a former president of both the Texas and National Apartment Associations and the Jefferson Neighborhood Association and a representative to the San Antonio Coalition of Neighborhoods, he earned the lasting respect and admiration of all those who were privileged to work with him; and

WHEREAS, Among Mr. Ross's greatest accomplishments was his admirable record of service as a member of the San Antonio City Council, a position he ably filled from 1993 until term limits dictated his resignation in 1997; credited with helping to bridge the gap between the Jewish and Hispanic communities, he was a tireless advocate of his constituents and took a special interest in water issues and in protecting the rights of the elderly; after his tenure with the council ended, he remained committed to the citizens of the Alamo City, advising his successor, Ed Garza, and later serving as a member of Mayor Garza's Committee on Integrity and Trust in Local Government; up until the time of his death, Mr. Ross distinguished himself as chair of the Joint City/County

Commission on Elderly Affairs; and
