WHEREAS, Texas is home to nearly 2,500 licensed osteopathic physicians, with increasing numbers of female, Hispanic, and African American practitioners, reflecting the diversity in the state's population; osteopathic physicians treat individuals throughout the state, including citizens in rural and other underserved areas, providing excellent primary care and preventive
