WHEREAS, Mr. Semos was elected to eight terms in the Texas Legislature, and while serving as a state representative, he became known as the Father of the Sesquicentennial for his work in behalf of the 150th anniversary of Texas independence in 1986; after leaving the legislature, he was elected to the Dallas County Commissioners Court and represented the southwestern portion of the county until 1994; and

WHEREAS, After serving as an elected official, Mr. Semos continued to be actively involved in the welfare of his community; he devoted his time to a number of worthy organizations, including Methodist Hospitals of Dallas, the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the World Affairs Council of Greater Dallas, the American Hellenic Educational and Progressive Association, and the Parkland Hospital Foundation; he was chairman emeritus of
