2 Comanche County are gathering in Austin to celebrate Comanche  
3 County Day at the State Capitol; and

4           WHEREAS, Created in 1856, Comanche County was named for the  
5 Comanche Indians, who once dominated the Southwest Plains; nestled  
6 in the hills of Central Texas, the area benefits from abundant  
7 natural resources that have given rise to a diverse agricultural  
8 economy; residents enjoy scenic vistas and the enchanting Lake  
9 Proctor, which provides a host of recreational activities and  
10 encourages tourism; and

11           WHEREAS, The county seat of Comanche has been honored as a  
12 Texas Main Street City, and is home to "Old Cora," one of the oldest  
13 existing original courthouses in Texas; each year the county  
14 celebrates its storied past and unique heritage with traditional  
15 events such as the Comanche Pow-Wow and the De Leon Peach and Melon  
16 Festival; and
