2 temper the profound sadness brought by the passing of Robert G.
3 Lynch on December 26, 2004; and

4 WHEREAS, A respected and distinguished educator, Mr. Lynch
5 became the founding dean of the graduate school of management at the
6 University of Dallas in 1966, a post he held until 1979 when he was
7 named vice president of administration; he began a 20-year term
8 teaching management in 1981, after which he briefly served as
9 interim dean of the graduate school of management; in 2002, Mr.
10 Lynch was named interim dean of the college of business at its
11 founding; and

12 WHEREAS, This esteemed leader possessed a sincere and lasting
13 concern for the welfare of his students and demonstrated his love of
14 education through his volunteerism with the Irving Public Library
15 system, serving two terms as treasurer of the Friends of the
16 Library; and

17 WHEREAS, Although his presence will be profoundly missed by
18 his family, friends, and the many beneficiaries of his service, Mr.
19 Lynch will not soon be forgotten, for he has left a remarkable
20 legacy that will continue to positively influence young Texans for
21 generations to come; now, therefore, be it

23 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Robert G. Lynch and
24 extend sincere sympathy to the members of his family: to his wife,
