WHEREAS, In 1983, Mr. Diaz emerged from retirement to act as a coordinator for the County of Hidalgo Community Service Agency, a post he held until 1995; he extended his commitment to helping people, and specifically aiding the elderly, by serving as a council member for the Area Agency on Aging and as a representative to the Texas Silver Haired Legislature; and

WHEREAS, Preceded in death by his beloved wife Alicia, this devoted family man logged countless hours as a volunteer for organizations such as the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program in Hidalgo County and the Borderfest Association; and

WHEREAS, Joe Diaz was an entertaining and straight-talking public figure who always spoke his mind, often in support of the Democratic Party or the Tripas Club; a hospitable, down-to-earth gentleman, he was a much-loved citizen of Hidalgo County and will
