12 WHEREAS, A recipient of the Texas Surplus Agricultural 13 Product Grant, which enables Texas growers to donate excess food to 14 help feed the hungry, the association also draws on its close 15 relationship with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice; Second 16 Harvest works with that agency to distribute surplus fresh produce 17 grown on prison land while helping inmates gain valuable work 18 experience and certifications; and
