4 moved soon thereafter to El Paso, where she has lived all her life;
5 a former professor at The University of Texas at El Paso, she
6 remains an avid UTEP fan and has been generous in donating her time
7 and energy to support its teams; and

8 WHEREAS, This remarkable 92-year-old El Pasoan has served as
9 president of El Paso Women's Bowling Association for 36 consecutive
10 years, and she has been a life member of the Women's International
11 Bowling Congress since 1972; Mrs. Loper has been inducted into the
12 El Paso Women's Association Hall of Fame as well as the Texas
13 Women's Bowling Hall of Fame, and her repute in the bowling world
14 has earned her an exemption from registration fees for all bowling
15 competitions; and

16 WHEREAS, A role model for bowlers everywhere, Mrs. Loper is
17 an inspiration to all who have been privileged to know her; now,
