- 6 enjoyed square dancing with his beloved wife, Tommie, photographing
- 7 weddings and graduations, and taking family portraits; moreover, he
- 8 was the official photographer for the Houston Square and Round
- 9 Dance Council for nine years and the photographer for the State of
- 10 Texas Square Dancers for one year; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Those fortunate enough to have known Frank Crocker
- 12 will remember his zest for life and his love of family and
- 13 community, and although he will be greatly missed, his legacy will
- 14 live on in his innumerable contributions as an educator and in the
