3 friends of Mary Pilger Giles of Iola, who died on August 16, 2004,

12 WHEREAS, The beloved wife of Lynn Giles, Mary Giles cherished
13 her role as the mother of four precious children, and was an
14 ever-present fixture at their school activities, offering her time
15 and talents as a dedicated and tireless volunteer; she further
16 benefited her community through her involvement in a host of
17 organizations, including the Iola Lions Club, the Iola High School
18 Band Club, and the Iola Volunteer Ambulance Service; moreover, she
19 was a lifetime member of St. Joseph Catholic Church and taught
20 religion education classes; and

21 WHEREAS, While it is especially painful to say goodbye to one
22 whose time here was far too brief, it is fitting to remember that
23 Mary Giles had a profound impact on those around her, and her memory
24 will long endure in the hearts of those whose lives she touched;

3 Legislature hereby pay special tribute to the life of Mary Giles and
4 extend deepest sympathy to the members of her family: to her
