9 put to good use in his civilian career with Big Bend Telephone
10 Company, and he received the Texas Telephone Association's award
11 for outstanding achievement in 1988 and served as president of the
12 Texas Statewide Telephone Cooperative Association on two separate

15 inspiration from his relationship with his wife, Robie Golden, and
16 their daughter, Traci, and from his fellow worshipers at Our Lady of

21 served as a director for both First National Bank and West Texas
