WHEREAS, A member of the United States Marine Forces Reserve, Corporal Fite was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 23rd Marine Regiment, 4th Marine Division; stationed in Al Anbar Province, he helped to provide security for one of Iraq's highways, a job that often involved escorting military convoys; he was manning a checkpoint when he was mortally injured by hostile action; and

10 WHEREAS, Corporal Fite graduated from Round Rock High School 11 and attended The University of Texas at Austin, where his prowess on 12 the trombone earned him a place in the Longhorn Band; and

WHEREAS, Drawn to the Marine Corps by its rigorous standards, Corporal Fite joined the Marine Junior ROTC while a freshman in high school and continued in the program through his senior year; he subsequently signed on with the reserve and went through boot camp and infantry training in California; in 2004 he was called up for full-time active duty and was soon promoted to corporal; and

WHEREAS, A man who gave his best effort to everything he cared about, this courageous Texan performed his dangerous mission with dedication and professionalism; his unfaltering devotion to duty, honor, and his country reflected the highest ideals of the armed forces, and his fellow citizens owe him a debt of gratitude that the passage of time can never diminish; now, therefore, be it
