2 of Georgetown on December 31, 2004, at the age of 93, has brought a
3 great loss to the family and friends of this esteemed man; and

5 Williamson County as state representative from 1947 to 1953; he was
6 an attorney in private practice from the time he was admitted to the
7 state bar in 1939 until his retirement in 2002; and

9 World War II and was a member of the American Legion Post #174 for
10 over 55 years; a charter member of the Georgetown noon Rotary Club,
11 he served as its president and was a Paul Harris fellow; he was also
12 a lifelong member of Georgetown's First Presbyterian Church and
13 served as trustee, elder, and elder emeritus; and

14 WHEREAS, Bill Stump lived a full and productive life, and
15 although he will be deeply missed, his memory will long be cherished
16 by those who were privileged to share his love and friendship; now,
