

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, Memories of a life filled with joyful times, loving  
2 moments, and meaningful accomplishments may comfort the family and  
3 friends of Dr. George Nathan Aldredge, Jr., of Dallas, who passed  
4 away on February 1, 2005; and

5           WHEREAS, Born in Dallas on September 4, 1916, this descendant  
6 of Texas pioneer families grew up in Dallas and attended The Terrell  
7 School; he earned his bachelor of science degree from Williams  
8 College in Williamstown, Massachusetts, in 1939 and received his  
9 medical degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1942; on  
10 December 27, 1941, Dr. Aldredge married the love of his life, the  
11 former Jeanne Chadbourne; and

12           WHEREAS, After serving as a doctor in the U.S. Army Medical  
13 Corps during World War II in New Guinea and the Philippines and  
14 earning the rank of captain, Dr. Aldredge performed his residency  
15 in orthopedic surgery at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor; in  
16 1951, he began his private practice in Dallas, where he continued  
17 his successful career until his retirement in 1985; and

18           WHEREAS, Dr. Aldredge gave generously of his time and energy  
19 to the field of medicine; he served as chief of staff at St. Paul  
20 Hospital in 1959 and taught emergency medicine at Southwestern  
21 Medical School; moreover, he was an active member of the Dallas  
22 County Medical Society, whose auxiliary is headquartered in Dr.  
23 Aldredge's boyhood home on Swiss Avenue, and he belonged to the  
24 American Medical Association and the American College of Surgeons;

2 WHEREAS, After retirement, Dr. Aldredge continued a life of  
3 service working with Tapings for the Blind and Meals on Wheels; a  
4 devoted Catholic, he and his wife hosted and participated in  
5 countless religious discussion groups; in his leisure time, Dr.  
6 Aldredge enjoyed ballroom dancing with his wife, and he was an  
7 accomplished photographer, ham radio operator, enthusiastic world  
8 traveler, and fan of Big Band Jazz, particularly the music of Benny  
9 Goodman; and

10 WHEREAS, Although this remarkable individual will be deeply  
11 missed, his spirit will continue to live in the hearts of those who  
12 were fortunate enough to know him; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas  
14 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Dr. George Nathan  
15 Aldredge, Jr., and extend sincere sympathy to the members of his  
16 family: to his wife of 63 years, Jeanne Chadbourne Aldredge; to his  
17 sons, George Aldredge, Vaughn Aldredge and his wife, Jamie,  
18 Christopher Aldredge and his wife, Cindy, Mark Aldredge and his  
19 wife, Laurie, Thom Aldredge and his wife, Trish, John Aldredge and  
20 his wife, Lydia, and Matthew Aldredge and his wife, Alison; to his
