WHEREAS, After serving as a doctor in the U.S. Army Medical Corps during World War II in New Guinea and the Philippines and earning the rank of captain, Dr. Aldredge performed his residency in orthopedic surgery at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor; in 1951, he began his private practice in Dallas, where he continued his successful career until his retirement in 1985; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Aldredge gave generously of his time and energy to the field of medicine; he served as chief of staff at St. Paul Hospital in 1959 and taught emergency medicine at Southwestern Medical School; moreover, he was an active member of the Dallas County Medical Society, whose auxiliary is headquartered in Dr. Aldredge's boyhood home on Swiss Avenue, and he belonged to the American Medical Association and the American College of Surgeons;
