R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, Arlington's Martin High School Chamber Singers,  
2 directed by Randy Jordan, received a most prestigious honor when  
3 they were selected to perform at both the State Choir Director's  
4 Convention and the National Choir Director's Convention; and

5           WHEREAS, Sponsored by the Texas Music Educators Association,  
6 the state convention is an annual event held in San Antonio; Martin  
7 High School Chamber Singers and 12 other choirs chosen from across  
8 Texas performed on February 10, 2005, in the ballroom of the San  
9 Antonio Convention Center; and

10           WHEREAS, The National Convention, presented every two years  
11 by the American Choral Directors Association, was held in Los  
12 Angeles in 2005; the Martin High School Chamber Singers, which  
13 performed four times at the convention, including an appearance at  
14 the Walt Disney Performance Hall in downtown Los Angeles, belong to  
15 an elite group of only 100 choirs selected from around the world to  
16 perform at this prestigious event; the group also provided the  
17 service music for the First Presbyterian Church of Santa Monica on  
18 Sunday, February 6, 2005; and

19           WHEREAS, These talented choir members and their director are  
20 a source of tremendous pride to the Lone Star State; they may take  
21 great pride in their outstanding achievements and they are most  
22 deserving of special recognition; now, therefore, be it

23           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas  
24 Legislature hereby honor the Martin High School Chamber Singers and

1 director, Randy Jordan, for being selected to perform at the 2005  
2 State Choir Director's Convention in San Antonio and at the  
3 National Choir Director's Convention held in Los Angeles in  
4 February 2005; and, be it further

7 House of Representatives.
