Keith Co. as an entry-level clerk; his determination and skill enabled him to rise through the ranks, and he eventually became president of the company; under his leadership, the business became the largest Anheuser-Busch distributor in the nation before his retirement in 2000; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. LaGrone took an avid interest in and made a personal commitment to community affairs; she lent her time and talents to the Denton Benefit League, Arts Guild, and Keep Denton Beautiful, and she also served on the city's Parks and Recreation Board; her concern for those less fortunate was evident from her active involvement on the board of Interfaith Ministries, a Denton

group that provides assistance to families in need; and
