1           WHEREAS, The White Settlement Independent School District is  
2 hosting a ground breaking ceremony for the new Brewer High School  
3 campus on March 17, 2005, and this first step toward a new high  
4 school is an exciting event for the entire community; and

5           WHEREAS, The new Brewer High School will be built in three  
6 phases; a freshmen and fine arts center will be built first,  
7 followed by construction of a three-story, 10th through 12th grade  
8 high school that includes classrooms, laboratories, athletic  
9 areas, and a library, and finally, a multipurpose competition  
10 facility with a football field and track will complete the campus;  
11 designed to be environmentally friendly, the new school will  
12 accommodate up to 2,400 students and promises to evoke a collegiate  
13 atmosphere; and

15 State of Texas to earn an eighth consecutive Recognized rating from  
16 the Texas Education Agency in 2004, the White Settlement ISD is
