RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Members of the Texas Motor Transportation 2 Association are visiting Austin on March 30, 2005, as they 3 celebrate Trucking Day at the State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, The trucking industry employs one out of every 11 workers in Texas, or more than 620,000 people; there are approximately 43,000 motor carriers registered with the Motor Carrier Division of the Texas Department of Transportation and in excess of 500,000 commercial vehicles operating daily in the Lone Star State; and

WHEREAS, Trucks transport nearly 60 percent of all the state's manufactured commodities, delivering necessary products to every Texas community, 72 percent of which rely exclusively on these motor carriers for their goods; the trucking industry further benefits the economy by generating over \$17.5 billion in annual salaries and paying almost \$1.7 billion in state and federal highway taxes and fees; and

WHEREAS, Safety has long been a priority of the motor carrier industry, and since 1980 the number of heavy trucks involved in accidents in Texas has decreased 40 percent, despite a 37.5 percent increase in trucking miles traveled; in addition to complying with the nation's environmental regulations, the Texas Motor Transportation Association has a Safety Certification Program for safety professionals, an industry-funded commercial motor vehicle safety initiative designed to promote safety on Texas highways, and

- 2 motoring public; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Texas Motor Transportation Association, the
- 4 state association of the trucking industry, has continued to team
- 5 with the Texas Department of Transportation to produce the
- 6 first-ever mobile highway safety classroom, featuring a
- 7 state-of-the-art, full-motion commercial truck driver simulator,
- 8 designed to enhance the driving skills of commercial truck drivers,
- 9 and to aid passenger vehicles in operating more safely as they share
- 10 the road with commercial vehicles; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The trucking industry is a vital part of the Lone
- 12 Star State's economy, and it is indeed appropriate to take this
- 13 opportunity to recognize the members of the Texas Motor
- 14 Transportation Association and to commend their contributions to
- 15 the state's economic well-being and their efforts to make Texas
- 16 roads safer; now, therefore, be it
