RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Cindy and Howard Rachofsky, eminent longtime 2 supporters of the Dallas Museum of Art, and a group of other Dallas 3 philanthropists have made the largest combined donation ever presented to the DMA; and 4

5 WHEREAS, Including more than 800 pieces from outstanding private collections of modern and contemporary art, the 6 gifts were announced in February 2005, following the completion of 7 the first phase of the museum's \$185 million centennial capital 8

9 campaign; and

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WHEREAS, Redeeming a pledge made in 2000, shortly after the launch of the campaign, the Rachofskys have marked the successful completion of phase one in several significant ways--by giving a generous contribution to the fund-raising drive, by making an outright donation to the DMA of various artworks, bequeathing to the museum the remainder of their collection, a stellar assemblage of leading-edge, contemporary art; and

WHEREAS, They have also promised the museum their house, a multilevel glass and steel building conceived by Richard Meier and designed to showcase the collection on a rotating basis; this stunning residence further has an expansive garden for sculpture and site-specific works; in addition to the art and property, the Rachofskys have pledged an endowment to enable their home to be used for public purposes; and

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WHEREAS, Cindy Rachofsky, who serves on the DMA Board of 24

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Trustees and chairs its development committee, and Howard Rachofsky, who is a member of the committee on collections, have previously given the museum a number of significant contemporary pieces; they have also been instrumental in the establishment of the DMA/amfAR Benefit Auction, one of the country's most successful charity art events, the proceeds of which go to museum acquisitions and AIDS research; and

WHEREAS, Together with Marguerite and Robert Hoffman and Deedie and Rusty Rose, who have similarly pledged their collections of contemporary art to the museum, the Rachofskys are transforming the DMA into a leading center for the study and enjoyment of art created over the past five decades; at the same time, by ensuring the superior quality of the museum's contemporary holdings, they are freeing the DMA to devote greater resources to other areas of need; and

WHEREAS, Established in 1903, the Dallas Museum of Art boasts an encyclopedic collection of more than 23,000 works spanning 5,000 years of history and representing all media; the extraordinary generosity of Cindy and Howard Rachofsky and their fellow donors exemplifies a remarkable degree of civic pride and advances dramatically the mission of that outstanding institution; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas Legislature hereby honor Cindy and Howard Rachofsky for their exceptional philanthropy in behalf of the Dallas Museum of Art and extend to them profound appreciation for cultural leadership that will forever enrich the citizens of this state; and, be it further
