1 WHEREAS, The Texas House of Representatives is pleased to

17 recognized as one of the leading producers and sellers of goat meat
18 in Texas, Mills County plays host to four sanctioned goat meat shows
19 each year and numerous goat raiser sales, taking in hundreds of
20 thousands of dollars each year and attracting people from across
21 the nation, as well as from Canada and South Africa; and

22 WHEREAS, Goldthwaite, its county seat, is the hometown of
23 renowned University of Texas Lady Longhorns basketball coach, Jody
24 Conradt; also in Mills County are the towns of Mullin, Priddy, and

1 Star, communities that make ideal places to live for many families
2 and retirees; and

3 WHEREAS, Residents of Mills County are making a notable
4 contribution to the Lone Star State, and it is indeed appropriate to
5 take this opportunity to honor them; now, therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas
7 Legislature hereby recognize March 10, 2005, as Mills County Day at
8 the State Capitol and extend warmest best wishes to the citizens of
9 Mills County for a memorable visit.
