- 3 February 28, 2005, at the age of 96; and
- WHEREAS, A native Texan, Happy Dyer was born on May 29, 1908,
- 5 in Whitewright, and throughout his full and generous life his
- 6 interest in making a positive difference in the lives of others
- 7 guided him to leave a lasting mark on his adopted home of Odessa;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Dyer enlisted in the U.S. Army as a young man,
- 10 serving his country with distinction during World War II; following
- 11 his military discharge, he returned to Odessa and cofounded
- 12 Abell-McHargue Lumber Company in nearby Midland, where he held the
- 13 position of manager until 1957; and
- 14 WHEREAS, This esteemed gentleman went on to enjoy a notable
- 15 tenure with Odessa Savings and Loan that spanned three decades,
- 16 retiring as its chairman in 1987; and
- WHEREAS, Over the years, Mr. Dyer lent his time and talents to
- 18 a host of worthy organizations, including the Permian Basin Oil
- 19 Show, the Odessa College Board, the Medical Center Development
- 20 Corporation, the Odessa Boy's and Girl's Club, the YMCA, the Mental
- 21 Health/Mental Retardation Center, and the Downtown Lions Club;
- 22 furthermore, he was a lifetime member of the Odessa Chuck Wagon Gang
- and the Odessa Chamber of Commerce; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The Ector County School Board, the Coliseum Building

- 1 Committee, the Savings and Loan Association, and the Lumberman's
- 2 Association of Texas also benefited from his expertise and
- 3 leadership; and
- WHEREAS, The civic involvement of Mr. Dyer earned him a host
- of accolades, including recognition as the 1978 Man of the Year and
- 6 2000 Outstanding Citizen of the Year by the Odessa Chamber of
- 7 Commerce; a recipient of the Heritage of Odessa Foundation
- 8 Community Statesman Award for community service, he was also
- 9 awarded an honorary degree in business administration from Texas
- 10 Tech University; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Above all else, Mr. Dyer was devoted to his
- 12 close-knit family, and his life was greatly enriched by the loving
- marriage he shared for 56 years with his wife, Una, who preceded him
- 14 in death; and
- WHEREAS, Those fortunate enough to have known Happy Dyer will
- 16 long remember him for the vision, enthusiasm, and integrity he
- 17 brought to each new task he took on; although he will be greatly
- 18 missed, his legacy will live on through the countless contributions
- 19 he leaves behind; now, therefore, be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas
- 21 Legislature hereby honor the memory of A. R. "Happy" Dyer and extend
- 22 deepest sympathy to the members of his family: to his son, Mike
