RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Donna Darovich retired from her position as director 2 of public affairs for The University of Texas at Arlington on 3 October 29, 2004, bringing to a close an exceptional tenure with the 4 school that spanned more than two decades; and

5 WHEREAS, A 1971 graduate of UTA, where she studied English 6 and served as the editor of the campus newspaper, *The Shorthorn*, Ms. 7 Darovich began her career that same year at the *Arlington* 8 *Citizen-Journal*; initially hired as the paper's homemaking editor, 9 she shortly thereafter became its first female city editor; and

WHEREAS, In the late 1970s, this talented journalist joined 10 11 the Pulitzer Prize winning news team of the Fort Worth 12 Star-Telegram; she experienced tremendous success as a features writer and amassed more than 100 state and national awards for her 13 14 writing, including two first-place prizes for feature writing from the Associated Press; moreover, she has twice been named the Most 15 Outstanding Woman Journalist in Texas by the Texas Press Women; and 16

WHEREAS, Combining her love of her alma mater and her 17 18 exceptional communication skills, Ms. Darovich returned to UTA in 1981 as director of news services and helped the school evolve into 19 a major university, tirelessly chronicling and promoting its many 20 21 achievements; with a staff of six, she produced monthly newsletters 22 and an annual media guide and implemented an array of successful 23 programs and publications, including Comcast, UTA Today, and the 24 UTA Messenger; and
