WHEREAS, Successful in a number of professional ventures, Mr. 11 12 Godfrey was an accountant and later a partner with the Childs Food 13 company, which merged with Kroger in 1957; he moved to Shreveport to 14 work with Kroger and also bought two radio stations and co-owned an automobile business; he became president of Nichols Industries and 15 served as a director of Kusan when it merged with Nichols; he 16 participated in the merger of Kusan with Bethlehem Steel, and in 17 1969 he purchased S-K Church Furniture Company; and 18

WHEREAS, A respected community leader, Mr. Godfrey was president of the United Fund, Jacksonville Public Library, and local Kiwanis club, as well as a lieutenant governor with the Kiwanis organization; he was on the boards of directors of the chamber of commerce and the Jacksonville Industrial Foundation, and he served as mayor and on the city council; an active congregant of

1 the First Presbyterian Church for nearly 70 years, he was selected 2 an advisory director of Austin Bank and was on the Nan Travis 3 Hospital board for 30 years; and
