1           WHEREAS, Memories of a life well lived may comfort the family  
2 and friends of Crawford Godfrey of Jacksonville, who died on  
3 February 24, 2005, at the age of 92; and

4           WHEREAS, Born in Kerrville on January 21, 1913, Mr. Godfrey  
5 spent his early years in Crandall and graduated from Kaufman High  
6 School; after attending Schreiner College, he went on to earn a  
7 degree from The University of Texas; and

8           WHEREAS, He married the love of his life, Helen Gray, in 1936,  
9 and the couple enjoyed an enduring union until her passing in 1997;  
10 and

11           WHEREAS, Successful in a number of professional ventures, Mr.  
12 Godfrey was an accountant and later a partner with the Childs Food  
13 company, which merged with Kroger in 1957; he moved to Shreveport to  
14 work with Kroger and also bought two radio stations and co-owned an  
15 automobile business; he became president of Nichols Industries and  
16 served as a director of Kusan when it merged with Nichols; he  
17 participated in the merger of Kusan with Bethlehem Steel, and in  
18 1969 he purchased S-K Church Furniture Company; and

19           WHEREAS, A respected community leader, Mr. Godfrey was  
20 president of the United Fund, Jacksonville Public Library, and  
21 local Kiwanis club, as well as a lieutenant governor with the  
22 Kiwanis organization; he was on the boards of directors of the  
23 chamber of commerce and the Jacksonville Industrial Foundation, and  
24 he served as mayor and on the city council; an active congregant of

1 the First Presbyterian Church for nearly 70 years, he was selected  
2 an advisory director of Austin Bank and was on the Nan Travis  
3 Hospital board for 30 years; and

4 WHEREAS, Crawford Godfrey touched the lives of countless  
5 individuals during his lifetime, and he will long be remembered for  
6 his impressive achievements and his unwavering commitment to his  
7 community; now, therefore, be it

8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas  
9 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Crawford Godfrey and  
10 extend sincere sympathy to the members of his family: to his sons  
11 and daughters-in-law, Thomas Gray Godfrey, Gary Crawford and Lois  
12 Ann Godfrey, and James David and Jean Godfrey; to his grandchildren  
13 and their spouses, David Gray and Rebecca Godfrey, Jennifer Lynelle  
14 and Geoffrey Bennett, Stephen Crawford and Laurie Godfrey, and  
15 Kevin Gray and Sara Godfrey; to his great-grandchildren, Ruth  
16 Lynelle Bennett and Madison Lea, Gavin Brant, Mandalyn Grahm, Kade  
17 Crawford, and Gray Joshua Godfrey; to his sister, Merle Bounds; and
