WHEREAS, Memories of a life filled with joyful times, loving moments, and meaningful accomplishments may comfort the family and friends of photojournalist and commercial photographer Maurice Miller of Austin, who passed away on December 13, 2004, at the age of 84; and

WHEREAS, Born in San Francisco on July 1, 1920, Mr. Miller served with the U.S. Army 84th Infantry during World War II, documenting the Allied advance, including the Battle of the Bulge and the liberation of Jews from Nazi concentration camps; his duties also included flying reconnaissance photography missions over enemy lines to provide intelligence and to document the progress of the Allies; and

WHEREAS, When the war ended, Mr. Miller came to Houston, where he was employed with the Houston Post for eight years, including five years as chief photographer; known for his photographic exploration of humanity, Mr. Miller worked as a stringer for Time and Life magazines and the Black Star photo agency and was a contributor to numerous other publications, including the Saturday Evening Post, Collier's Business Week, Architectural Forum, Arts and Architecture, and Parade Magazine; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Miller was a widower who cared for his two children while studying at the University of Houston and working full-time; in the 1960s, he was a staff photographer in the architecture department of Rice University as well as for the
