R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, The Texas House of Representatives is pleased to  
2 welcome the visiting delegation from Rio Bravo, including Mayor  
3 Juan G. Gonzalez, to the State Capitol on this day, March 30, 2005;

5           WHEREAS, Formed in April 1982, Rio Bravo has risen above  
6 myriad challenges and undergone a host of positive changes in the  
7 past 23 years; the community has been transformed from a colonia  
8 into a blossoming city thanks to the diligent efforts of local  
9 public servants who endeavor to forge better lives for area  
10 citizens by meeting emerging issues head on; and

11           WHEREAS, Under the able guidance of city leaders, Rio Bravo  
12 has accomplished much in recent years; the city overcame a deficit  
13 and reached financial stability in January 2005, and residents may  
14 look forward to the opening of a new community park and Boys and  
15 Girls Club in the days ahead; and

16           WHEREAS, Moreover, incoming businesses continue to stimulate  
17 the local economy, and the area population, which has grown from 500  
18 residents to nearly 8,000, will soon be served by new water,  
19 wastewater, sewer, and storm drain systems; the community also  
20 boasts two elementary schools and a middle school, and medical care  
21 is now available seven days a week to those in need; and

22           WHEREAS, Citizens of Rio Bravo can take great pride in their  
23 prospering South Texas town, for the future is indeed bright for the  
24 city and its residents; now, therefore, be it

2   Legislature hereby recognize March 30, 2005, as Rio Bravo Day at the  
3   State Capitol and extend sincere best wishes to all Rio Bravo  
4   residents on this noteworthy occasion; and, be it further

7   as an expression of high regard by the Texas House of
