WHEREAS, No stranger to awards, this esteemed educator was elected Clark Teacher of the Year in 2002-2003 and was selected to participate in a Fulbright Memorial Fund Teacher Study in Japan in 2002; in addition to serving on several school and district committees, he is a national AP world history reader and an AP consultant; and
