WHEREAS, With the passing of Robert S. Morris on March 14, 2005, at the age of 71, the people of San Antonio have lost a highly regarded architect whose work included numerous homes, the Ecumenical Center for Religion and Health, and plans for the Alamo grounds; and

WHEREAS, A native of San Antonio, Mr. Morris was born into a family whose forebears include one of the original Canary Island families who founded the city's first municipal government; and

WHEREAS, This proud Texan attended Phillips Exeter Academy, where he was named a Prep School All-American swimmer, and received both bachelor's and master's degrees in architecture from Stanford University, where he was a varsity team swimmer; and

WHEREAS, After completing his army service as a field artillery officer and later in military intelligence, he returned to his hometown and established a successful career as an architect known for exceptional skill and creative vision; and

WHEREAS, Other structures that he designed include the Southwest Airlines Reservation Center and Saint Mary's Hall Chapel Theater, and he directed the renovation of the Chapel House at the Bishop Jones Center of the Diocese of West Texas, Capers Hall at St. Mark's Episcopal Church, and the gift store at the Alamo, where he served as staff architect for that venerable Texas site; and
