1 WHEREAS, George Thomas of Houston has made an indelible 2 impact on public radio as general manager of KTSU-FM, the station of 3 Texas Southern University; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Thomas was appointed to his current position as general manager in 1995, but he first established a relationship with TSU in 1972, when he served as director of special veterans programs; he also distinguished himself as an account executive at KYOK-AM, where he organized the first college internship program between the station and Prairie View A&M University; a former project coordinator with the Department of Labor, Mr. Thomas is also an accomplished jazz musician, writer, and community organizer; and

WHEREAS, Under his leadership, KTSU has experienced unprecedented growth, receiving local and national attention for its quality programming and gaining affiliate status from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting and National Public Radio; the station's membership has grown to more than 14,000 individuals, and its budget has increased by more than 100 percent due to ongoing efforts to identify external funding resources; in 2002, the Houston Press named KTSU the best radio station in the city, largely due to Mr. Thomas and his dedication to expansion; and

WHEREAS, As general manager, this esteemed administrator has implemented professional staff development, provided salaries for on-air personalities, created the first major long-term strategic

- 6 Committee and has been invited to represent African American public
- 7 radio stations on CPB's advisory panel for fund distribution; he is

- 10 WHEREAS, George Thomas is a consummate professional who has
- 11 changed the landscape of public broadcasting in Houston, and it is
- indeed a pleasure to recognize his extraordinary accomplishments;
