RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Dr. Rosie Collins Sorrells is being inducted into 2 the African American Education Archives and History Program 3 Educators Hall of Fame in Dallas on April 23, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Founded in 2001, the program was initiated by the Dallas Regional, National Alliance of Black School Educators and the African American Museum to create a repository of artifacts, documents, and visual images that chronicle the African American experience in Dallas County and to pay tribute to individuals such as Dr. Sorrells who have made significant contributions to African American education in Dallas; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Sorrells began her more than 40-year career in education as a classroom teacher and advanced through administrative positions of increasing responsibility to become the director of early childhood education for the Dallas Independent School District in 1978; in this pivotal role, she positively affected thousands of students, parents, teachers, and administrators by developing curriculum guides and strategies; and WHEREAS, Following her retirement from DISD in 1993, Dr.
