## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Bobby Morrow, world-renowned three gold medal 2 winner in the Track and Field Championships at the Olympic Games of 3 1956 held in Melbourne, Australia, will celebrate in 2006 the 50th 4 anniversary of his historic feat; and

5 WHEREAS, He was considered to be the "fastest human in the 6 world" because of his winning the 100-meter dash and also the 7 200-meter dash in a world record time of 20.75 seconds in the World 8 Olympics; and

9 WHEREAS, His accomplishments in the 100-meter dash, the 10 200-meter dash, and the 4 X 100 relay team at this world-class event 11 were heralded by the news media in every country of the world, and 12 he graced the covers of *Life* magazine, *Sport Magazine*, *Track and* 13 *Field Magazine*, and *Sports Illustrated* magazine, in which he was 14 named Sportsman of the Year; and

WHEREAS, He was awarded the prestigious Sullivan Award as the 15 top amateur athlete in the United States in 1957 by the New York 16 Athletic Association, was named Southwesterner of the Year by the 17 18 Texas Sports Writers Association, as well as the Amateur Athlete of the Year by that organization, Athlete of the Year in 1956 by Sport 19 Magazine, Athlete of the Year in 1956 by a poll taken by the Knute 20 21 Rockne Foundation among the sportswriters and sportscasters of 22 America, and was listed in the Outstanding Young Men of America in 23 that special year; and

WHEREAS, Bobby Morrow grew up in the Rio Grande Valley, where

he graduated from San Benito High School as one of the premier
 track-and-field high school athletes in America; and

3 WHEREAS, San Benito, Texas, named its new high school
4 gymnasium after Bobby Morrow; and

5 WHEREAS, The image of Bobby Morrow crossing the Olympic 6 finish line graces Coca-Cola playing cards and Kodak film boxes; 7 and

8 WHEREAS, The veteran sportswriter Maxwell Stiles of Los 9 Angeles named Bobby Morrow the greatest sprinter of all time; and

10 WHEREAS, He personally appeared on numerous radio and 11 television networks, including the syndicated *Ed Sullivan Show* and 12 *What's My Line* television show; and

WHEREAS, He has been inducted into the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame, the U.S. Track and Field Hall of Fame, the Texas Sports Hall of Fame, the Helms Track and Field Hall of Fame, the National Athletic Intercollegiate Association Hall of Fame, and the Abilene Christian University Hall of Fame where he received his college degree in 1958 and was a student listed in Who's Who among students in American Colleges and Universities; and

20 WHEREAS, He was named one of the Nine Great Living Americans 21 by the United States Chamber of Commerce in 1957 and was received by 22 the President and Vice President of the United States and numerous 23 mayors and governors across America; and

24 WHEREAS, One of his three gold medals was given to the 25 Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C.; another was given to 26 the Texas Sports Hall of Fame; and his third gold medal was given to 27 his alma mater, Abilene Christian University, and it has recently

been displayed in the Bob Bullock Texas State History Museum's Legends of Sports Exhibit in our state capital city; and

3 WHEREAS, He is the proud father of twins, Ron Morrow of 4 Euless, Texas, and Vicki Morrow Watson of Hurst, Texas, and another 5 daughter, Elizabeth Kelton of Austin, Texas, and he and his wife, 6 Judy, now reside in Sealy, Texas, near Houston; and

7 WHEREAS, He will be forever remembered as a one-of-a-kind 8 champion who brought fame to the great State of Texas and the United 9 States of America, which he represented in international 10 competitions, and he has been admired around the world by young and 11 old alike from all walks of life; now, therefore, be it

12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas 13 Legislature hereby salute Bobby Morrow for his lifetime 14 achievements upon the golden anniversary of his three gold medal 15 victories in the Melbourne, Australia, Olympic Games; and, be it 16 further

17 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be 18 prepared for Bobby Morrow and his family as well as the libraries of 19 his hometown, his alma mater, and the Texas Sports Hall of Fame.
