RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The citizens of Corsicana lost a dedicated public 2 servant, longtime educator, role model, and friend with the passing 3 of Olin Nickleberry on April 13, 2005, at the age of 75; and

WHEREAS, Born on August 7, 1929, in Marietta, Texas, Mr. 4 5 Nickleberry was the oldest son in a family of nine children; raised on a farm, he worked hard and developed a sense of responsibility 6 from a young age, and the size of his family also provided him with 7 early lessons in the importance of sharing and teamwork; as a young 8 adult, he won a basketball scholarship to Bishop College, where he 9 was voted most outstanding athlete and earned his bachelor's degree 10 11 in education; after graduation, he put his career plans on hold for 12 two years to serve as a paratrooper in the U.S. Army; in 1965, he moved to Corsicana to accept the position of head basketball coach 13 14 at G. W. Jackson High School, and he later earned his master's degree in physical education and his certification in special 15 education from East Texas State University; and 16

WHEREAS, During the course of his life, this esteemed 17 18 gentleman was a teacher, a coach, and a special needs instructor in the Corsicana and Blooming Grove public school districts; his 19 lifelong involvement in sports began as a player and extended to his 20 21 years as a coach and as a referee, an avocation he pursued for 50 years; drawing on the discipline he learned in the army and the 22 insight he gained through his many years officiating at sporting 23 events, he brought consistency and fairness to his service in 24

public office, which began in 1991, when he became the first African American commissioner in Navarro County, a post to which he was elected three times; and

WHEREAS, A deeply spiritual man and devout Christian, Mr.
Nickleberry was a faithful member of Bethlehem Baptist Church for
40 years and served as a deacon and chair of the deacon staff; and

7 WHEREAS, In addition to numerous other affiliations, Mr. 8 Nickleberry was a member of the VFW in Corsicana and the Kerens and 9 Corsicana/Navarro County chambers of commerce, a charter member of 10 the Central Texas Baseball Umpires Association, a former vice 11 president of the Texas Association for Adult and Continuing 12 Education, and a former president of the Sunrise Lions Club; and

WHEREAS, The strength of our communities depends on the 13 14 dedication of individuals like Olin Nickleberry, who spent his life 15 nurturing the development of young people while working tirelessly to improve the city of Corsicana; though it is impossible to gauge 16 17 the full effect of a man's life, some individuals leave their unmistakable mark on the world as they move through it, and Olin 18 Nickleberry's contributions to his fellow Texans will continue to 19 resonate for many years in the lives of all who knew him; now, 20 21 therefore, be it
