- 9 and he was responsible for at least 1,500 live foals, including a
- 10 host of top champions; and
- 11 WHEREAS, This grand ol' sire of Texas was truly deserving of
- 12 his illustrious status, and his offspring continue to contribute to
- 13 the state's reputation of fine horses; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas
- 15 Legislature hereby honor the legacy of Gonzales Joe Bailey.
