1 WHEREAS, Memories of a life filled with joyful times and
2 meaningful accomplishments may comfort the family and many friends
3 of Robert Layton Simmons, Jr., of Dallas, who passed away on April
4 23, 2005, at the age of 58; and

5 WHEREAS, Born in Amarillo on April 11, 1947, Mr. Simmons was a
6 talented athlete and an invaluable member of the Amarillo High
7 School football team; following his 1966 graduation, he enrolled at
8 Texas Tech University and earned a bachelor's degree in
9 international business in 1970; and

10 WHEREAS, This dynamic Texan began his career as a marketing
11 executive for two start-up companies, and in 1977 he joined Dr. Bill
12 Bright's Campus Crusade for Christ, working as a fund-raiser for
13 the organization's evangelistic film, *Jesus*; he later moved to
14 Dallas, where he used his exceptional marketing skills to benefit a
15 number of businesses in the health care, retail, and oil and gas
16 industries before becoming a founding partner in the merchant
17 banking firm of Trinity River Capital Ventures; and

18 WHEREAS, A civic-minded individual, Mr. Simmons gave
19 generously of his time and talents to community endeavors,
20 including the Father of the Year Awards luncheon and Wipe Out Kids'
21 Cancer; and

22 WHEREAS, First and foremost, Mr. Simmons was a man of deep
23 faith and spiritual devotion and a valued member of Park Cities
24 Presbyterian Church and numerous ministries; and

1 WHEREAS, Beloved husband, father, and son, Bob Simmons will
2 long be remembered for his love of his family, his church, and his
3 community; although he will be greatly missed, his legacy will live
4 on in the hearts of those whose lives he so richly blessed with his
5 kindness and strength; now, therefore, be it

7 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Robert Layton
8 Simmons, Jr., and extend deepest sympathy to the members of his
