WHEREAS, During his nearly 30-year tenure in law enforcement, Sergeant Hunter worked in various departments, including field operations, CID, special investigations/narcotics, personnel and training, and the Tarrant County task force; a mentor to many officers, rookies, and civilian employees, he served as a patrol sergeant at the time of his untimely passing; and

21 WHEREAS, Honored for his accomplishments in law enforcement, 22 this esteemed professional earned numerous performance and service 23 awards and received 31 letters of commendation from residents of 24 Grand Prairie, fellow officers, and the Boy Scouts of America; and
