4 WHEREAS, Born to Joe Monroe Epps and Lonnie Riley Epps on
5 February 12, 1915, Mr. Epps was the devoted husband of Bertha Uhl
6 Epps, with whom he shared a marriage that spanned nearly seven
7 decades and was blessed with three children; and

8 WHEREAS, After attending The University of Texas, where he
9 played on the football team, Mr. Epps moved to Houston and began his
10 career as a machinist with Hughes Tool Company; for 16 years, he
11 owned and operated Houston TBA Supply and eventually retired from
12 B. F. Goodrich Company in 1984 after more than 20 years of service
13 there; and

14 WHEREAS, He gave of his time and talents to the Lutheran
15 Church and the Boy Scouts of America, which he served as a
16 scoutmaster; in addition to growing beautiful orchids, he was a
17 talented woodworker and built everything from church altars to
18 furniture for his grandchildren; and

19 WHEREAS, Affectionately known to his family as "Big Daddy,"
20 Joe Epps was a wonderful father, grandfather, and great-grandfather
21 who will be greatly missed, but his memory will live on in the
22 hearts of those whose lives he so richly blessed with his kindness
23 and love; now, therefore, be it
