1 WHEREAS, The well-being of our state's senior citizens

3 resources vital to enhancing their quality of life; and

4 WHEREAS, With more than 35 million members, the AARP
5 addresses the needs and interests of persons age 50 and older by
6 providing information on issues important to this growing
7 demographic group, advocating on consumer and legal issues, and
8 promoting community service; and

9 WHEREAS, On May 21, 2005, residents of El Paso are welcoming
10 the grand opening of an AARP Information Center, a "one-stop shop"
11 for older Texans and their families to learn about local, state, and
12 national issues that affect seniors; with an estimated 37,000 AARP
13 members, El Paso is the second city in Texas, after Houston, to host
14 such a center; and

16 Information Center will undoubtedly enrich the lives of local
17 residents, and all those associated with the organization merit
18 special recognition for bringing this important project to
