WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan also held deep religious convictions; he joined Antioch Missionary Baptist Church in 1937 and was ordained as a deacon in 1946; his passion was visitation and ministry to the sick and homebound members of the congregation, and he offered encouragement and inspiration to countless people in need; and
