R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life came to a close with the  
2 passing of Ezequiel C. Cavazos of Raymondville on February 24,  
3 2005, at the age of 80; and

4 WHEREAS, Mr. Cavazos was born in Lyford on July 8, 1924, to  
5 Willacy County pioneers Maria and Blas T. Cavazos; growing up, he  
6 worked alongside his parents and four siblings in the family  
7 general store while attending school; and

8 WHEREAS, A devoted patriot, Mr. Cavazos enlisted in the U.S.  
9 Army to serve his country in World War II and participated in the  
10 Normandy invasion; lost behind enemy lines for more than 30 days, he  
11 was eventually reunited with his unit and completed his tour of  
12 duty; and

13 WHEREAS, His meritorious record of service earned him the  
14 EAME Campaign Medal with four bronze stars, the victory ribbon,  
15 three overseas service bars, and a good conduct medal; Mr. Cavazos  
16 was later honored with the Cross of Malta as a member of the  
17 military honor guards of both the VFW and American Legion, and the  
18 Normandy Jubilee Medal at the 50th anniversary of D-Day for his role  
19 in liberating France; and

20 WHEREAS, Following his return to civilian life, Mr. Cavazos  
21 wed Sofia Abrigo and embarked on a successful career as an  
22 automobile salesman that would span 35 years; known for his  
23 honesty, he took great pride in his work and in providing for his  
24 wife and eight children; and

1           WHEREAS, An example to all who were privileged to know him,  
2 Zeke Cavazos will long be remembered for his love of family,  
3 community, and country, and although he will be greatly missed, his  
4 legacy will live on in the hearts of those whose lives he touched  
5 with his friendship and generosity; now, therefore, be it

6           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas  
7 Legislature hereby pay special tribute to the life of Ezequiel C.  
8 Cavazos and extend deepest sympathy to the members of his family: to  
9 his wife of 58 years, Sofia Abrigo Cavazos; to his children, Mary  
10 Hope, Nora Noreen, Ezequiel, Hector, Rolando, Harry, Elroy, and  
11 Norbert; and to his other relatives and friends; and, be it further

12           RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be

14 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Ezequiel C.
