4 WHEREAS, Born on February 8, 1917, in Bend, Mr. Willhelm grew
5 up in a close-knit family with eight siblings; as a young man, he
6 served his country in the role of medic in the Medical Corps during
7 World War II with the Air Force in North Africa; and

8 WHEREAS, Following his return to the states, he attended San
9 Angelo Agricultural College; known to many in his field as "Dr.
10 Willhelm," he was a poultry specialist for Western Hatcheries of
11 Dallas and West Flour Mill in West; and

12 WHEREAS, Mr. Willhelm and the former Oriel Hanson were joined
13 in matrimony on December 28, 1942, in Bend and together they were
14 blessed with a son, Rex; and

15 WHEREAS, Baptized as a Jehovah's Witness in 1966, LaJoy
16 Willhelm was devoted to his faith, his loved ones, and his
17 profession, and he leaves behind a legacy to treasure for those who
18 held him dear; now, therefore, be it
