RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives of the State of Texas 2 joins the citizens of Corpus Christi in mourning the life of Travis 3 A. Peeler, a lawyer, lawmaker, and civic activist, who died March 4 19, 2005, at the age of 80; and

5 WHEREAS, Born in Christine on January 17, 1925, Mr. Peeler 6 served with the United States Army Air Corps in France during World 7 War II and flew more than 25 missions over Germany; and

8 WHEREAS, After the war, he attended Texas A&I University and 9 The University of Texas School of Law, from which he graduated 10 second in his class in 1953; early in his career, Mr. Peeler worked 11 as a briefing attorney for the Texas Supreme Court and as a Corpus 12 Christi assistant city attorney; he later practiced law as a 13 partner in the firm of Prichard, Peeler, Cartwright, and Hall until 14 his retirement in 1998; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Peeler was elected to the Texas House of 15 Representatives in 1960 and served four consecutive terms; during 16 his tenure in the legislature he introduced successful legislation 17 18 to abolish the poll tax and secured passage of a measure providing for automatic voter registration renewal for those who vote 19 consistently; in a lighthearted vein, he added to a bill that was 20 21 assured of passage an amendment regarding punishment for Peeping 22 Toms, reducing the sentence from five years to two and a half years 23 if the perpetrator had only one eye; and

WHEREAS, A lifelong student of politics, this distinguished

Texan taught political science at Del Mar College in the 1970s and also served for two years as chairman of the Nueces County Democratic Party; and
