1           WHEREAS, Memories of a life filled with joyful times and  
2 meaningful accomplishments may comfort the family and friends of  
3 Stan Reinhard of Brady, who passed away on May 12, 2005, at the age  
4 of 58; and

5           WHEREAS, Born to Edmund and Ruby Reinhard on October 4, 1946,  
6 in Guadalupe County, Mr. Reinhard earned a bachelor's degree in  
7 range management at Southwest Texas State University; he was  
8 commissioned as a second lieutenant in the United States Air Force  
9 and completed assignments at Keesler Air Force Base in Mississippi  
10 and Ramstein Air Force Base in Germany; and

11           WHEREAS, Following his return to civilian life in 1972, Mr.  
12 Reinhard began a 13-year tenure with the USDA Soil Conservation  
13 Service, serving as the district conservationist in San Saba and  
14 Mason; he then worked as a real estate agent for several years  
15 before accepting a position as a technician with the Hickory  
16 Underground Water Conservation District in 1991; he was promoted to  
17 manager and served in an advisory position in water planning; in  
18 2001, he was elected to represent Texas on the National Ground Water  
19 Board and actively fought for the conservation of natural resources  
20 and property owners' rights; and

21           WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan was a valued member of his  
22 community and gave of his time and talents to a number of  
23 professional, civic, and religious organizations; a board member  
24 and vice chair of the Heart of Texas Hope House and an elder at the

1 New Covenant Fellowship church, he lent his expertise to the Range  
2 Management Society, the McCulloch County Extension Service  
3 Committee, and the McCulloch Industrial Foundation; he was also  
4 active with the Heart of Texas Emmaus community and a longtime  
5 member of its "Good Ol' Boys Under God's Construction" reunion  
6 group; and

7 WHEREAS, Beloved husband, father, and grandfather, Stan  
8 Reinhard will long be remembered for his love of his family,  
9 community, and country, and although his presence will be sorely  
10 missed, his legacy will live on in the hearts of those whose lives  
11 he so richly blessed with his warmth and friendship; now,
