

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, The 2000 Census found that the Hispanic population  
2 in the Dallas-Fort Worth area increased by more than 110 percent  
3 between 1990 and 2000, and the Texas State Data Center is projecting  
4 that it will grow by another 300 percent by 2040; and

5           WHEREAS, One of the top 100 colleges for Hispanic students,  
6 the University of North Texas in Denton has more than 60 outstanding  
7 research and service centers that provide specialized training and  
8 programs for students, faculty, and the public, but it does not have  
9 a special center for Mexican-American studies; and

10           WHEREAS, Such a center would provide classes, programs, and  
11 special events that help prepare students to live and work in a  
12 state with a growing Latino population, assist in the recruitment  
13 of Hispanic students, and encourage high school and junior high  
14 students to stay in school; and

15           WHEREAS, The State of Texas would benefit immeasurably from  
16 the establishment of a center at the University of North Texas  
17 dedicated to studies about this important segment of our  
18 population; now, therefore, be it

19           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas  
20 Legislature hereby express its intent that the University of North  
21 Texas establish a Center for Mexican-American Studies; and, be it  
22 further

23           RESOLVED, That the Texas House of Representatives state  
24 explicitly its legislative intent that the university use any

1 available funds, including legislative appropriations made to the  
2 university for instruction, operations, or infrastructure support,  
3 federal funds, or gifts or grants, up to \$200,000, to establish or  
4 operate the center, and that all funds collected by the center be  
5 dedicated to the establishment and operation of the center.
