WHEREAS, Born in Peoria, Illinois, in 1938, Mr. Shake served in the U.S. Army, attended Texas A&M University, and studied with an electrician's apprenticeship program; he eventually became active in the electrical workers' union and nurtured a burgeoning interest in politics; in the 1970s, this hardworking man was instrumental in establishing a regional licensing program for the electrical workers in the Rio Grande Valley; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Shake was a lifelong member of the Democratic 11 12 Party who was admired by his colleagues for his dedication to labor 13 needs and the issues facing working families; he was the business manager at the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers 14 Local Union 278 (IBEW), a position he held for 12 years, and he had 15 also served the union as organizer, president, executive board 16 member, joint apprenticeship and training committee member, 17 delegate to the Texas State Association of Electrical Workers, 18 delegate to the 35th and 36th IBEW International Convention, 19 delegate and president of the Coastal Bend Labor Council, 20 21 secretary-treasurer of the South Texas Building and Trades Council, 22 and a member of the Supervisory Committee of the Local Union 278 23 Federal Credit Union; Mr. Shake was an original member of the Workforce Development Board and was appointed by the city council 24
