## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to security in public schools.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 37.108 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 37.108. MULTIHAZARD EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN;
7	SECURITY AUDIT. (a) Each school district shall adopt and
8	implement a multihazard emergency operations plan for use in
9	district schools. The plan must address mitigation, preparedness,
10	response, and recovery as recommended by the United States
11	Department of Homeland Security. The plan must provide for:
12	(1) district employee training in responding to an
13	<pre>emergency;</pre>
14	(2) mandatory school drills to prepare district
15	students and employees for responding to an emergency;
16	(3) measures to ensure coordination with local
17	emergency management agencies, law enforcement, and fire
18	departments in the event of an emergency; and
19	(4) the implementation of a security audit as required
20	by Subsection (b).
21	(b) At least once every three years, a school district shall
22	conduct a security audit of the district's facilities. To the
23	extent possible, a district shall follow security audit procedures
24	developed by the Texas School Safety Center or a comparable public

- 2 (c) A school district shall report the results of the
- 3 security audit conducted under Subsection (b) to the district's
- 4 board of trustees.
- 5 SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 37.203, Education Code,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The center is <u>advised</u> [<del>governed</del>] by a board of directors
- 8 composed of:
- 9 (1) the attorney general, or the attorney general's
- 10 designee;
- 11 (2) the commissioner, or the commissioner's designee;
- 12 (3) the executive director of the Texas Juvenile
- 13 Probation Commission, or the executive director's designee;
- 14 (4) the executive director of the Texas Youth
- 15 Commission, or the executive director's designee;
- 16 (5) the commissioner of the Texas Department of Mental
- 17 Health and Mental Retardation, or the commissioner's designee; and
- 18 (6) the following members appointed by the governor
- 19 with the advice and consent of the senate:
- 20 (A) a juvenile court judge;
- 21 (B) a member of a school district's board of
- 22 trustees;
- 23 (C) an administrator of a public primary school;
- (D) an administrator of a public secondary
- 25 school;
- 26 (E) a member of the state parent-teacher
- 27 association;

- 1 (F) a teacher from a public primary or secondary
- 2 school;
- 3 (G) a public school superintendent who is a
- 4 member of the Texas Association of School Administrators;
- 5 (H) a school district police officer or a peace
- 6 officer whose primary duty consists of working in a public school;
- 7 and
- 8 (I) two members of the public.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 37.205, Education Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 37.205. SAFETY TRAINING PROGRAMS. The center shall
- 12 conduct for school districts a safety training program that
- 13 includes:
- 14 (1) development of a positive school environment and
- 15 proactive safety measures designed to address local concerns;
- 16 (2) school safety courses for law enforcement
- 17 officials, with a focus on school district police officers and
- 18 school resource officers;
- 19 (3) discussion of school safety issues with parents
- 20 and community members; and
- 21 (4) assistance in developing a multihazard emergency
- 22 operations plan for adoption under Section 37.108 [specialized
- 23 training for the staff of alternative education programs and
- 24 <del>juvenile justice alternative education programs</del>].
- 25 SECTION 4. Subchapter G, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 37.2051 to read as follows:
- 27 Sec. 37.2051. SECURITY CRITERIA FOR INSTRUCTIONAL

- 1 FACILITIES. The center shall develop security criteria that school
- 2 districts may consider in the design of instructional facilities.
- 3 SECTION 5. Section 37.208, Education Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 37.208. ON-SITE ASSISTANCE. On request of a school
- 6 district, the center  $\underline{may}$  [shall] provide on-site technical
- 7 assistance to the district for:
- 8 (1) school safety and security audits; and
- 9 (2) school safety and security information and
- 10 presentations.
- 11 SECTION 6. Subsection (b), Section 37.215, Education Code,
- is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (b) The center [board] shall biannually prepare a budget
- 14 request [for the center] for submission to the legislature.
- 15 SECTION 7. Subchapter A, Chapter 46, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 46.0081 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 46.0081. SECURITY CRITERIA IN DESIGN OF INSTRUCTIONAL
- 18 FACILITIES. A school district that constructs a new instructional
- 19 facility or conducts a major renovation of an existing
- 20 instructional facility using funds allotted to the district under
- 21 this subchapter shall consider, in the design of the instructional
- 22 <u>facility</u>, <u>security</u> <u>criteria</u> <u>developed</u> <u>by</u> the <u>Texas School Safety</u>
- 23 <u>Center under Section 37.2051.</u>
- SECTION 8. Sections 37.206 and 37.213, Education Code, are
- 25 repealed.
- SECTION 9. (a) Not later than December 1, 2005, the Texas
- 27 School Safety Center shall:

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- 1 (1) develop a school safety program that includes
- 2 assistance to school districts in developing a multihazard
- 3 emergency operations plan as required by Section 37.205, Education
- 4 Code, as amended by this Act; and
- 5 (2) develop security criteria for the construction and
- 6 renovation of school district instructional facilities as required
- 7 by Section 37.2051, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 8 (b) Not later than March 1, 2006, each school district shall
- 9 adopt a multihazard emergency operations plan as required by
- 10 Section 37.108, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 11 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
